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Introduction

This document contains selected citations illustrating how Core Knowledge Language Arts (CKLA) fulfills the Tennessee English Language Arts Standards. Each reference corresponds to specific pages in the Teacher Guide for a particular CKLA Domain or Unit and includes the applicable grade level, Unit or Domain number, and page number(s).

CKLA is a K-5 integrated literacy program that closes the achievement gap by building content knowledge systematically and coherently. CKLA students gain strong foundational skills and receive explicit language instruction, build substantial content knowledge through encounters with a rich variety of texts and contexts, develop analysis and expression in reading and writing, and become wonderful conversationalists. CKLA students gain the essential knowledge of the world and the strong foundation in literacy necessary to prepare them for secondary education and life as global citizens in the twenty-first century.

Integrated Model of Literacy

Throughout CKLA, students learn to analyze text and craft well-reasoned responses to texts, problems, or ideas. Whether students are reading, writing, spending dedicated time developing language and foundational skills, or speaking and listening, they practice careful analysis and reasoning, drawing on evidence and content knowledge to craft their work.

Strong Content Knowledge

CKLA understands that students must have a wide range of content knowledge for academic and professional success. CKLA domains and units include a substantial amount of literary and informational texts from across academic disciplines, helping students gain a critical understanding of other perspectives and cultures.

A Blended Approach to Research and Media Skills

CKLA offers students authentic tasks to prepare them for future educational goals and professional life. Rather than just writing a report, students might research a significant invention and use that research in a pitch persuading others why this invention is most important to contemporary life. Rather than writing a straightforward report on a Renaissance artifact, they research a famous Renaissance site, then write and film commercials advertising that site to Renaissance travelers. Throughout CKLA, assignments such as these encourage students to incorporate research and technology into everyday tasks, thereby preparing them for real-world situations they will encounter later in their education and profession.

Responsive to Demands of Audience, Purpose, and Task

CKLA lessons consistently encourage students to consider the purpose of reading, writing, and speaking and listening. Students explore how writers use tone to convey a particular message, then practice changing the tone in their own oral and written work. In the Writing Studio program, students spend substantial time learning about the purpose of different text types and shaping their own work to fulfill specific purposes and target particular audiences.

Evidence-centered

Throughout CKLA, students focus on evidence. They identify and analyze the evidence written in literary and informational texts and compare it to the oral evidence shared by a speaker. They craft their own oral and written work with attention to incorporating the strongest possible evidence. They consider how different kinds of evidence work, from the detail or description of a narrative text to the scientific facts presented in a pamphlet on earthquake safety.

Differentiated

CKLA offers teachers numerous options for differentiation at the point of instruction. Every lesson includes differentiation suggestions for students who are ready for additional challenge or who need additional support to access content. Differentiation options specifically for English Language Learners (ELLs) are also integrated into every lesson. The supplemental Language Studio program offers additional lessons to help students access core content.
