What do students read in Amplify CKLA®?

In Amplify CKLA, texts serve a variety of purposes, from building background knowledge, vocabulary, and comprehension to building decoding and fluency skills.

In grades K–2, instruction is segmented between two strands: Knowledge and Skills.

Reading within the Knowledge Strand is centered around authentic read-alouds and trade books that are intentionally sequenced to build content knowledge and vocabulary in specific domain topics around literature, history, science, and the arts. Because research shows that students' listening comprehension outpaces their reading comprehension until their early teens, Amplify CKLA strategically uses read-aloud text in this strand, allowing students to focus their cognitive energy on gaining meaning from the words and better understanding from the images.







Reading within the Skills Strand centers around carefully crafted Student Readers that teach students how to read. Structured as chapter books, these readers are 100% decodable and were developed to align with Amplify CKLA's scope and sequence for phonics, directly connecting instruction to student practice in connected texts. Students use the Readers to practice decoding, fluency, and comprehension during shared reading lessons, targeted close reading sessions, in small groups, and independently.

Topics covered include Chinese history, rulers, art, music, entertainment, and everyday life.	
Domain 3 The Ancient Greek Civilization	<i>Pythagoras and the Ratios</i> Julie Ellis	Pythagoras and Octavius want to win a music contest but first they must figure out how to play their musical instruments in unison. Pythagoras makes an important discovery—notes that sound pleasant together have a certain mathematical ratio. When Pythagoras applies this ratio to his cousin's pipes and lyres, the result is music to his ears.	
Domain 4 Greek Myths	<i>King Midas and the Golden Touch</i> Charlotte Craft	In a retelling of a favorite Greek myth, a king finds himself bitterly regretting the consequences of his wish that everything he touches would turn to gold.	
Domain 5 The War of 1813	<i>The Star-Spangled Banner in Translation</i> Elizabeth Raum	How long is four score and seven years? Just what are unalienable rights? These translations make important historical documents meaningful. Each book translates the work of a primary source into a language you can understand.	
Domain 6 Cycles in Nature	<i>The Snowflake: A Water Cycle Story</i> Neil Waldman	With a double-page spread for each month, this book describes the journey of a single drop of water throughout the year.	






With Harriet Tubman as her guide, Cassie retraces the steps escaping slaves took on the real Underground Railroad.	
Domain 10 Human Body	<i>Baby Doctor's Guide to Anatomy and Physiology</i> Baby Professor	The human body has many different parts that work together to make you, you and me, me. This kid-friendly book makes learning about the human body more fun!	
Domain 11 Immigration	<i>Emma's Poem: The Voice of the Statue of Liberty</i> Linda Glaser	In 1883, Emma Lazarus, deeply moved by an influx of immigrants from Eastern Europe, wrote a sonnet that was to give voice to the Statue of Liberty. The Statue, thanks to Emma's poem, slowly came to shape our hearts, defining us as a nation that welcomes and gives refuge to those who come to our shores.
