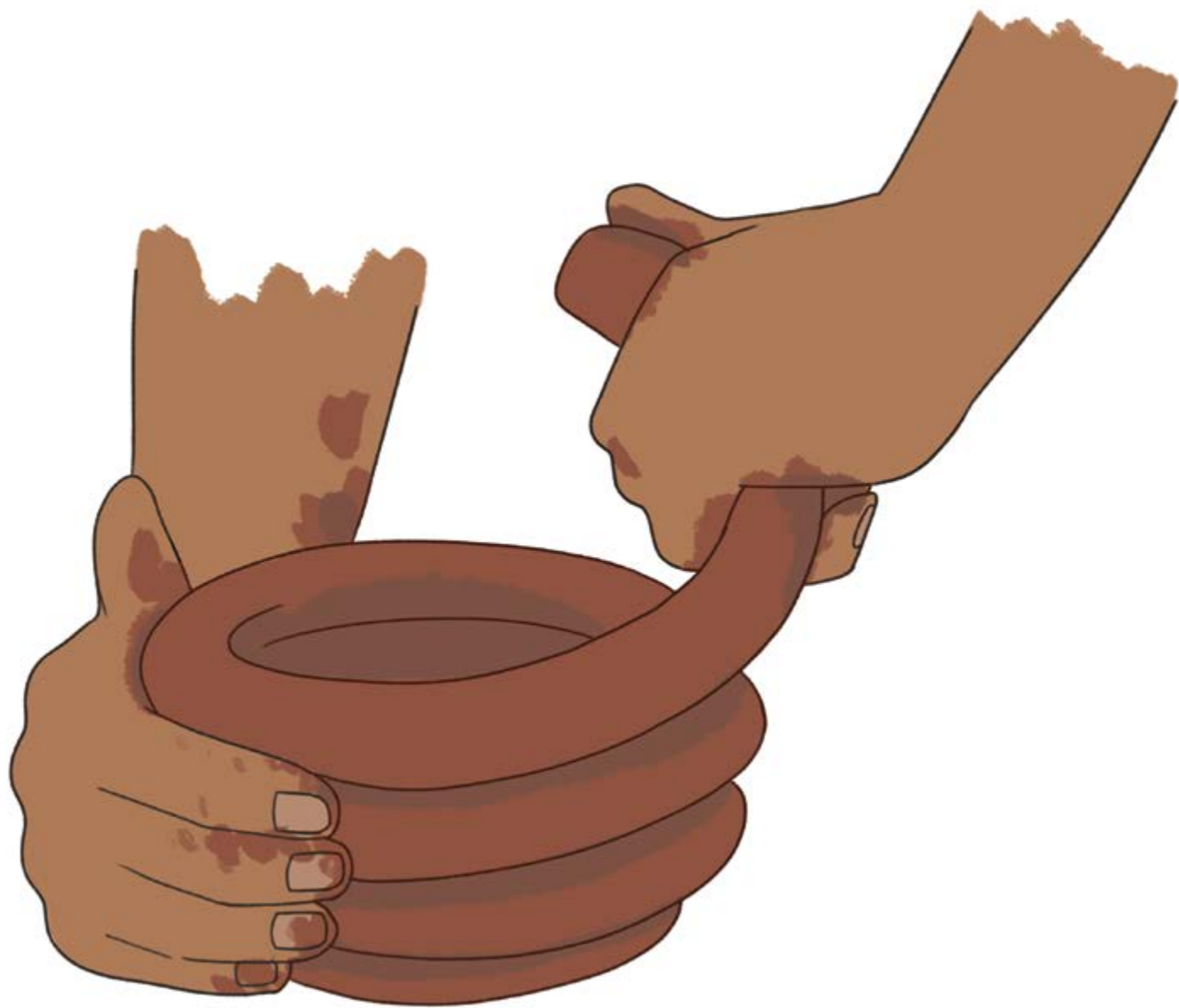

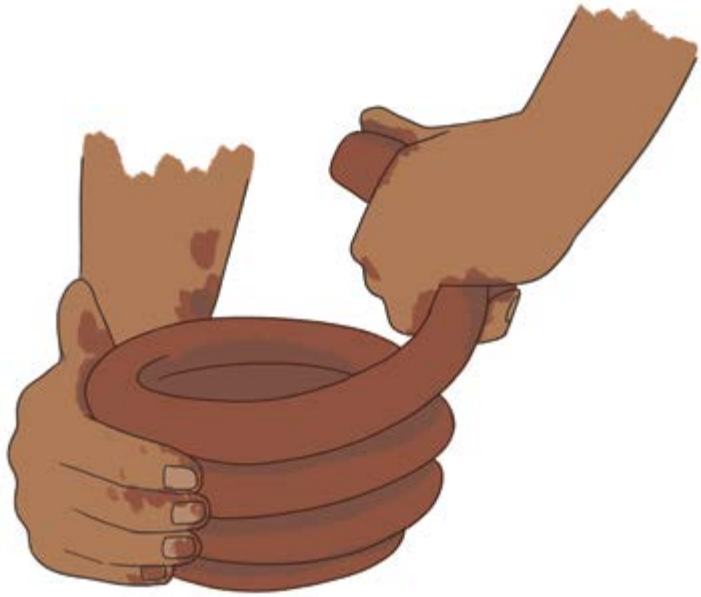

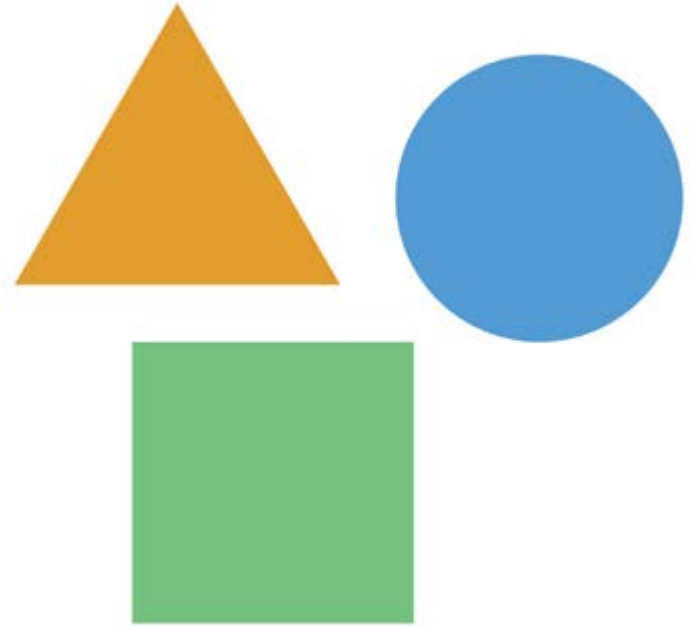

AL SELF-PORTRAIT WITH MONKEYS, 1941

Self-Portrait with Monkeys
The artist painted this self-portrait in 1941, during her recovery from a severe injury to her spine. The painting is a powerful statement of her identity and her connection to nature. The monkeys, which were a common sight in Kahlo's childhood in Mexico, are depicted as her protectors and companions. The bird of paradise flower, a symbol of love and passion, is also present in the painting.

Self-Portrait with Monkeys
This painting is a self-portrait by Frida Kahlo, created in 1941. It depicts Kahlo surrounded by four black monkeys in a lush, green jungle setting. The monkeys are positioned around her, with one on her shoulder, one on her arm, and two others in the background. 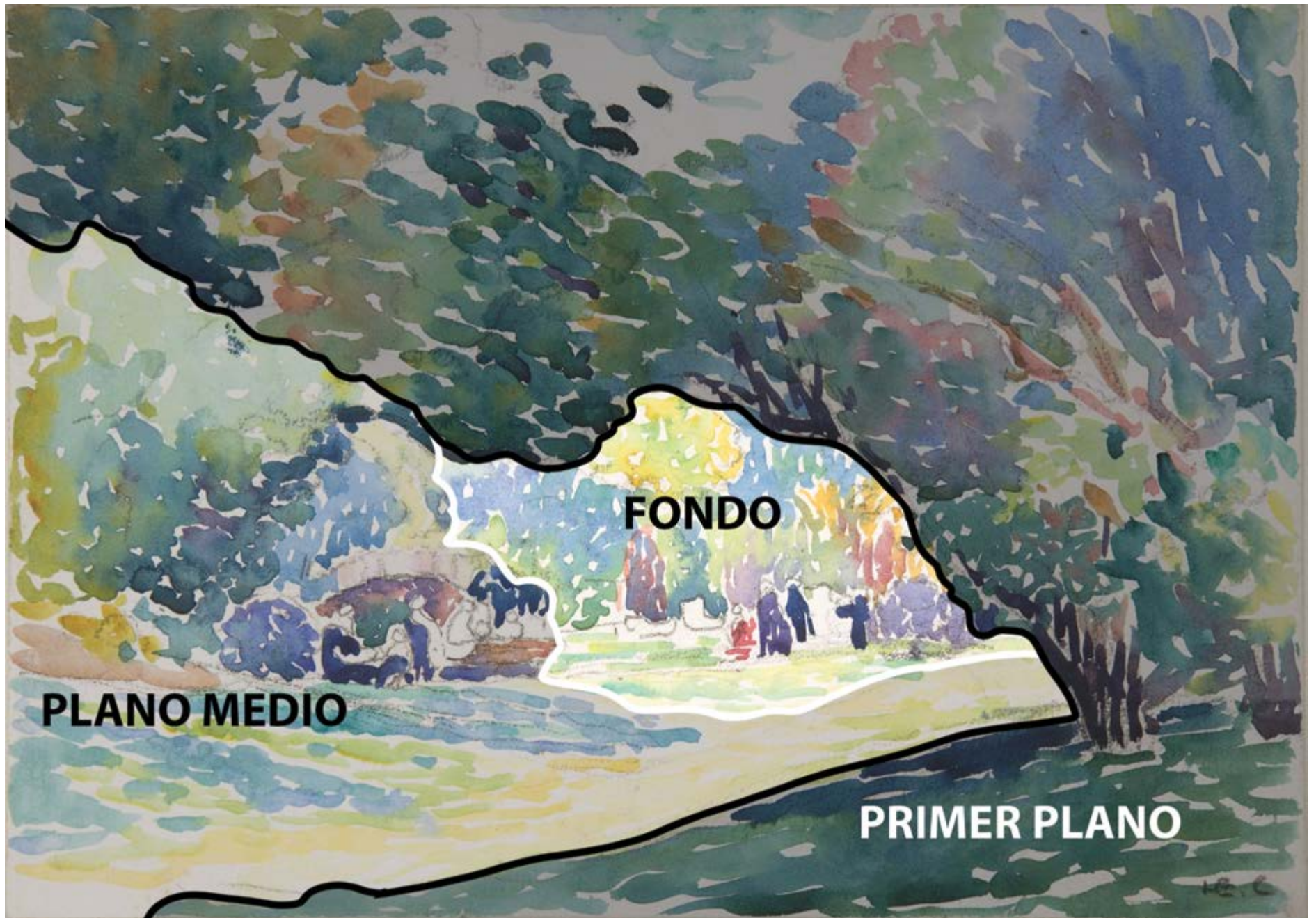
