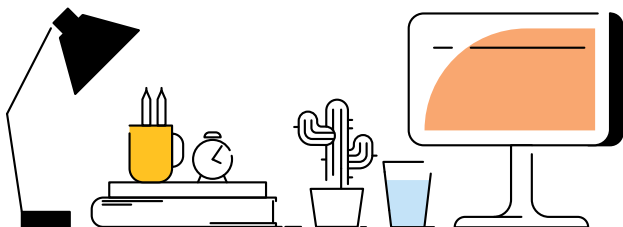

# What I need to know about ARP ESSER funding

ARP ESSER funding comes from the American Rescue Plan signed in March 2021. Each state received funding based on the size of their student population. From these allocations, state departments of education provided allocations to districts using the Title I funding formula. What are the goals of this funding?	Funds are meant to help support students and educators recover from lost instructional time during COVID-19 and get back on track academically.	While the legislation and other guidance has made it clear these are flexible funds, a main goal is to help provide materials, strategies, and support to help students recover from lost instructional time during COVID-19 and get back on track academically.
When does this funding need to be spent?	ESSER II funding must be <b>obligated by Sept. 30, 2023</b> .	ESSER III funding must be <b>obligated by Sept. 30, 2024</b> . However, The U.S. Department of Education recently released guidance that allows states to request an 18-month extension on liquidation of funds.

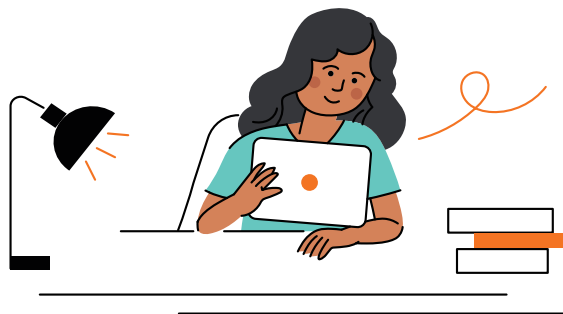
