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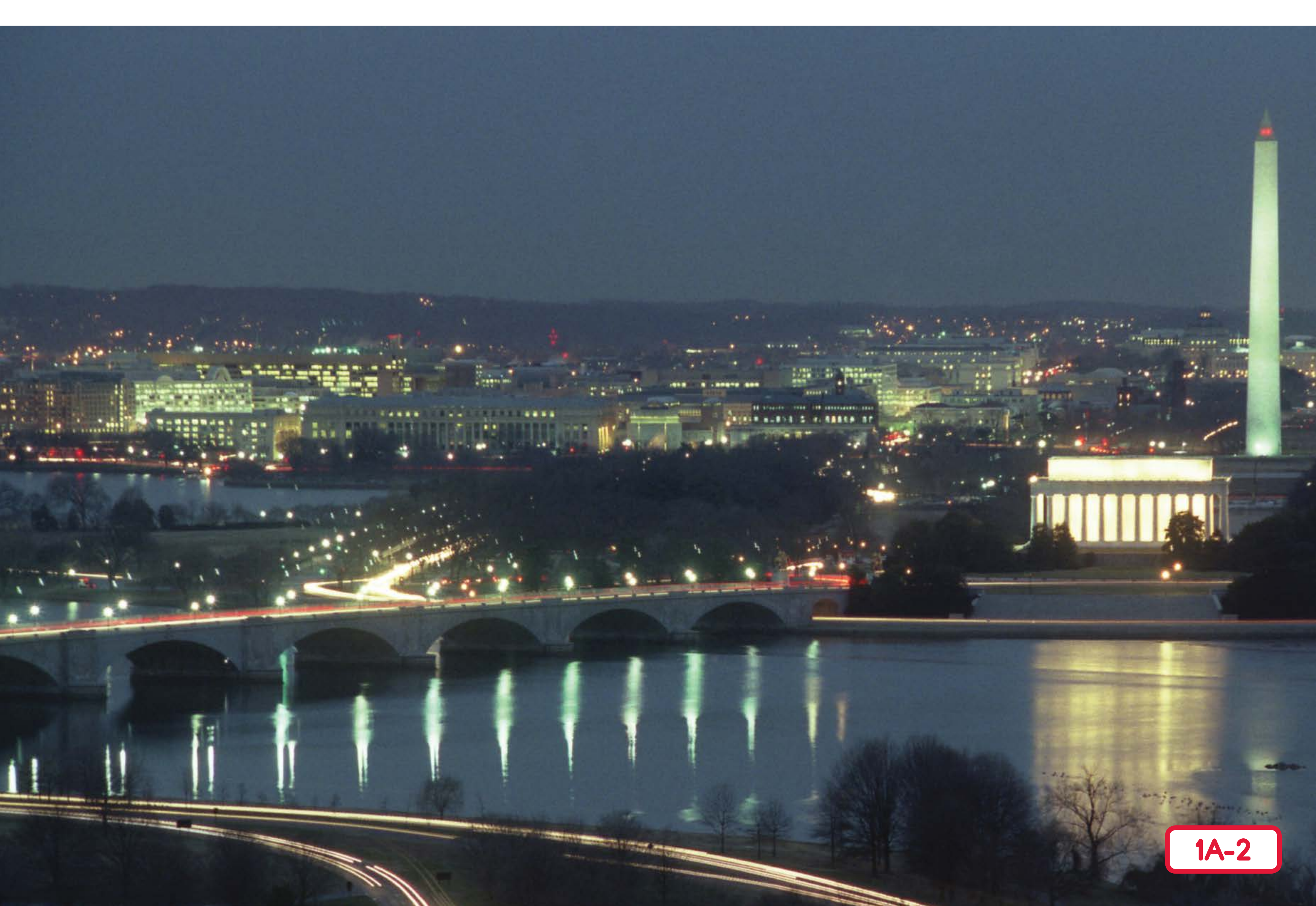


Flip Book Introduction

3. a row of words across a page, particularly in a poem (*noun*)





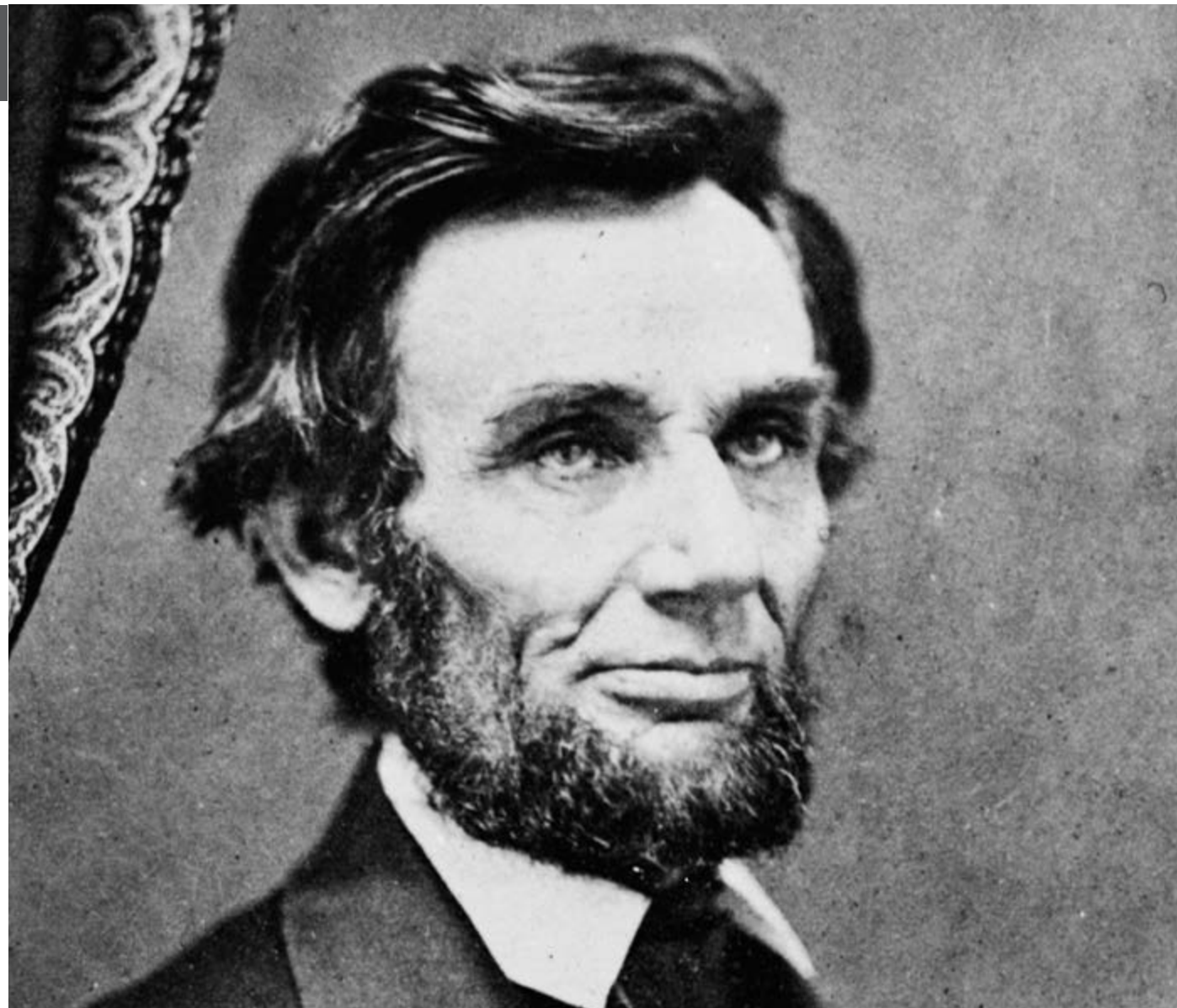
Turn (Poster 2M)
